HE government will from next year start "naming and shaming" public listed companies (PLCs) that do not have any women on their board of directors.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak said companies on the list would risk losing out on government contracts.

He said until December last "year, women made up 16.8 per cent of the PLCs" boards.

"However, we want to achieve our 30 per cent target.

"This means we need another 13.2 per cent. I have issued a warning that next year, we will publish the list of PLCs that do not have women as board members.

"We will name and shame these
