Single mum will never forget the hard times

50-year-old who escaped poverty goes all out to help

"I raised five kids alone, Every

"As a mother, you want your children to break fast with scrumptious meals, but at that time I could not afford it.

"When no buka puasa events could be found, we broke fast with biscuits," reminisced the founder and president of Persatuan Kemajuan Wanita Pulau Pinang (Perjuanita), a non-governmental organisation that helps single mothers, the disabled and elderly,

Mydin Pathmah, who has since remarried, said when life became better

remarried, said when life became better for her, she knew she had to give back to society.

"When my c hildren grew um I

grew up, I knew I had to create an NGO to help the needy. "I know that

feeling too well because I was there – when you

are lost and alone but still want to keep your chin up.
"So, I formed Perjuanita four years ago," she said at the association's annual open house at the United Muslim Association's premises in Transfer Road recently.

About 250 people from underprivileged, single parent families broke fast at the event.

Perjuanita also gave out RM50 each to 70 guests and food hampers worth RM50 to several families.
"I was a volunteer with the state Social Welfare Department.
"This was how I met struggling families and because I am a single mother, we connected and some of us became good friends," she said.
